Stages – John 21:18-19

In the past week I have attended a number of graduation ceremonies. It is a time of change. A time of growing up. A time of completion, and a time of beginnings. This is a time when people read Ecclesiastes 3. Go ahead, look it up and read it. It starts in verse one saying, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven." It reminds me of this stage in life when students transition to college or to the work place. When they start facing more responsibilities, like paying for their own cars and insurance. Graduation signals a completion of one stage of life. And there are many such stages. These transition points are spoken of by Solomon and by Jesus. Jesus concludes His reference to the stages of life with a command. Although given to Peter, I believe it applies equally to us as well. He says, through all of the stages of life, "Follow me!" Are you willing to move to that stage?
