Judas Hangs

When Judas realized what he had done, and tried to undo it, the priests would not let him. They told him it was his problem, tough luck. So we read in verse 5 that "...Judas threw the money into the temple and left."

Let's read on and find out what happened to the tainted money that had bought the capture of Jesus. It was kind of like a bounty that had been placed on Jesus' head. I think it is interesting what Judas did with the money. The Temple was the house of God. So, he threw the money in to God and the place where the priests worked. Then starting in verse 6 we read:

"The chief priests picked up the coins and said, 'It is against the law to put this into the treasury, since it is blood money.'" (Now this tells us the priests knew what they had done was not lawful or right, but they were determined to do it anyway.) It goes on, "So they decided to use the money to buy the Potter's field as a burial place for foreigners. That is why it has been called the Field of Blood to this day. (Note: Everyone knew of the blood money paid to destroy an innocent man. Everyone knew it was "blood money.") Verse 9 continues: "Then what was spoken by Jeremiah the Prophet was fulfilled: 'They took the thirty silver coins, the price set on him by the people of Israel, and they used them to buy the Potter's field, as the Lord commanded me.'" (Jeremiah 19:1-13; 32:6-9.) It is amazing how precise God's prophecy is.
