WEEKLY FEAST

Matthew 5:41-42 (NLT) If a soldier demands that you carry his gear for a mile, carry it two miles. ⁴²Give to those who ask, and don't turn away from those who want to borrow.

Roman soldiers were walking along a Roman road in Galilee. The centurion was at the rear, observing and watching for stragglers. The soldiers carried their military hardware and packs; however, auxiliaries or noncitizens moved the luggage and supplies. This Roman sentry was ready and able to fight at a moment's notice. Near their resting spot was a Jewish man working his plot. One of the standing sentries called to him, "Come and carry my burden." This so-called "press into service" usually evoked outrage from a Jew, but this man came and casually picked up the load as the soldiers moved out.

At the end of a mile any Jew would customarily throw the burden to the ground in disgust, but this man said, "I will carry your burden on to your next rest." At that place he laid down the load and said to all, "I am a disciple of the prophet Jesus, called the Christ of God, and I follow His teachings. Will you come with me to see and hear the Savior?"

I know that is a fictional story, but it could have happened. "Going the second mile" was a new and revolutionary idea in the first century, but it is a common call for us as Christians today. How many miles do you walk in a day?
